



# State Project 102-357: Storm Armoring and Waterproofing of Bridge No. 02295 Route 136 over the Norwalk River

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) is announcing construction activities related to the storm armoring and waterproofing of the Stroffolino Bridge over the Norwalk River.

The primary work will include waterproofing of the bascule pits by raising the front wall of the bascule piers to a projected high water elevation, repairing electrical conduits, limit switches, environmental upgrades consisting of a new oil water separator, installation of suction stand pipes, installation of new submersible sump pumps and upgrading the navigational lights.

There will be sidewalk and individual roadway lane closures for the repairs of the sidewalk hatches, work inside the bascule pit, the raising of the front walls of the bascule piers and for materials delivery. A full roadway closure is expected to take place mostly at night during weekdays for short time durations. Navigational closures will also be required for the replacement of electrical components. These closures will be scheduled during night time or off-peak navigation periods as much as possible.

## Phase 1: February 13<sup>th</sup> through March 31, 2017 (47 Days)

- Organization/Material Procurement and Engineering Phase, no roadway or navigational closure expected.

## Phase 2: Construction work – April 1 through September 3, 2017 (156 Days)

Anticipated closures:

- Navigational Closures – 4/3/17 – 4/30/17 – All waterway closures/restrictions will be requested 90 days in advance in accordance with the USCG Construction Requirements.
- Full roadway closure required – 4/3/17 – 4/30/17 **Detour (attached)**
- South sidewalk and single lane closure (Eastbound Direction) – 4/3/17 – 4/30/17
- North sidewalk and single lane closure (Westbound Direction) – 5/29/17 – 6/4/17

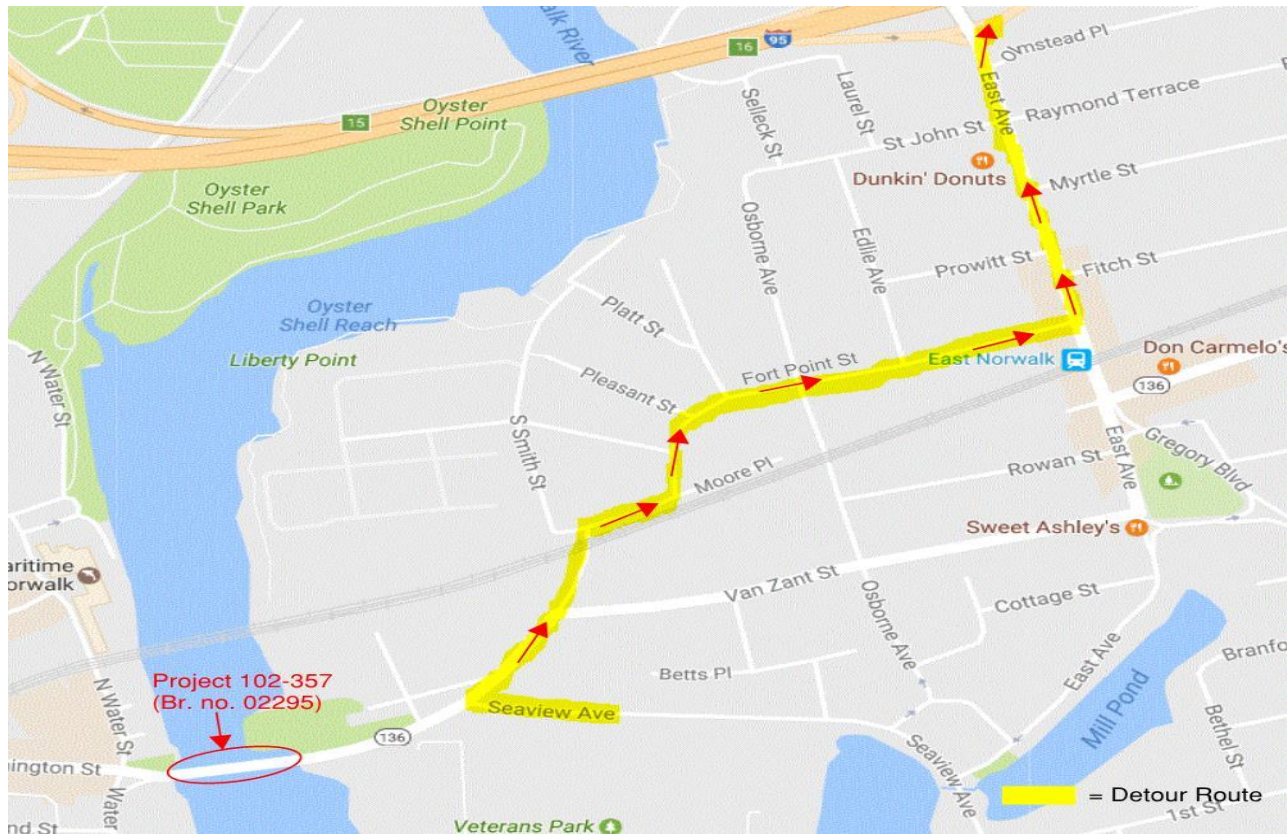
## Please Be Advised:
