The Connecticut Department of Transportation is announcing the following Walk Bridge Program activities for Saturday, January 13, 2018 through Saturday, January 20, 2018.

RAILROAD ACTIVITY

- Tree clearing work is anticipated to occur along the east side of the Danbury Branch Line between Marshall Street and Science Road, Monday, January 15 through Friday, January 19, 2018 from 7:00 AM-4:00 PM. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated. [Map](#)

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The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) is undertaking the Walk Bridge Program to replace the deteriorating railroad bridge over the Norwalk River in Norwalk, CT. One of the oldest movable bridges in the country, the Walk Bridge is a critical transportation link on the Northeast Corridor between Washington, D.C., New York City and Boston carrying four tracks of Metro-North Railroad, Amtrak and freight service.
