



Walk Bridge Program CONSTRUCTION NEWS

Effective Friday, June 15, 2018

The Connecticut Department of Transportation is announcing the following Walk Bridge Program activities for Friday, June 15 through Monday, June 25, 2018.

RAILROAD ACTIVITY

- Track work is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line, Monday, June 18 through Friday, June 22, 2018 from 6:30 AM-5:00 PM, between Washington Street and Jennings Place. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated and access to all properties will be maintained. Please watch for the entering and exiting of construction vehicles. - Nighttime catenary foundation drilling is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line, between Washington Street and Marshall Street, the night of Friday, June 15 through the morning of Monday, June 18, 2018 from 10:00 PM-6:00 AM. This work is also anticipated to occur Friday, June 22 through the morning of Monday, June 25, 2018. Noise and construction illumination are anticipated as a result of this work. Access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- Installation of temporary construction walls is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line as part of the first half of the Ann Street Railroad Bridge superstructure replacement. This work will occur the night of Friday, June 15 through the morning of Monday, June 18, 2018. Operations are anticipated to occur continuously from 10:00 PM on Friday night through 6:00 AM on Monday morning. Noise and construction illumination are anticipated as a result of this work. Access to all Ann Street properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- Structural steel demolition is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line as part of the first half of the Ann Street Railroad Bridge superstructure replacement. This work will occur the night of Friday, June 15 through the morning of Monday, June 18, 2018. These Operations are anticipated to occur continuously from 10:00 PM on Friday night through 6:00 AM on Monday morning. Noise and construction illumination are anticipated as a result of this work. Access to all properties will be maintained. Due to demolition operations occurring this weekend, Ann Street will be closed to pedestrians. Pedestrians are encouraged to use Marshall Street. [Map](#)
- Danbury Branch rail service will be bused the weekend of Friday, June 15 through Monday, June 18, 2018 to facilitate the first half of the Ann Street Railroad Bridge superstructure replacement. More information on service changes is available at: www.mta.info/mnr.
- Track work is anticipated to occur in the vicinity of Norden Place, Monday, June 18 through Friday, June 22, 2018 from 6:30 AM-3:30 PM. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated and access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- Track work is anticipated to occur in the vicinity of Norden Place at night, Friday, June 15 through the morning of Sunday, June 17, 2018 from 10:00 PM-6:00 AM. Intermittent noise and construction illumination are anticipated as a result of this work. Please note, an increased number of train horns will be heard as a result of this activity. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated and access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)

LOCAL ROAD ACTIVITY

- A nighttime lane closure will occur on East Avenue to facilitate subsurface investigation work, Monday, June 18 through the morning of Saturday, June 23, 2018 from 9:00 PM-5:00 AM. Alternating one-way traffic and access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- As of June 13, 2018, Ann Street is closed to through traffic to facilitate the first half of the Ann Street Railroad Bridge superstructure replacement. The road will be closed until August 27, 2018, with driveway access maintained to Ann Street properties. Please note, Ann Street will be closed to pedestrians the weekend of Friday, June 15 through Monday, June 18, 2018. Pedestrians are encouraged to use Marshall Street. ADDITIONAL WORK ACTIVITIES

- House demolition work is anticipated to occur in the vicinity of Goldstein Place, Monday, June 18 through Friday, June 22, 2018 from 7:00 AM-5:00 PM. All access to Liberty Square businesses, residences and parking will be maintained. Intermittent noise is anticipated as a result of this work. Please watch for the entering and exiting of construction vehicles, which will be parked in front of the three houses. [Map](#)
- Selective tree clearing work is anticipated to continue on the south side of the New Haven Line railroad tracks, west of Howard Avenue and progress towards Triangle Street, Monday, June 18 through Friday, June 22, 2018, from 8:00 AM-3:30 PM. Noise is anticipated as a result of this activity. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated and access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- Rock grinding work is anticipated to occur on the south side of the New Haven Line railroad tracks, west of Howard Avenue and progress towards Triangle Street, Monday, June 18 through Friday, June 22, 2018 from 8:00 AM-3:30 PM. Please note, noise is anticipated as a result of this activity and construction vehicles will remove materials at night, between 10:00 PM-4:00 AM. [Map](#)

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The [Connecticut Department of Transportation \(CTDOT\)](#) is undertaking the Walk Bridge Program to replace the deteriorating railroad bridge over the Norwalk River in Norwalk, CT. One of the oldest movable bridges in the country, the Walk Bridge is a critical transportation link on the Northeast Corridor between Washington, D.C., New York City and Boston carrying four tracks of Metro-North Railroad, Amtrak and freight service.
