Connecticut Department of Transportation Walk Bridge Activities Announcement: Friday, July 6 - Monday, July 16, 2018

Railroad Activity

- Installation of temporary retaining walls is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line as part of the first half of the Ann Street Railroad Bridge superstructure replacement. This work will occur continuously from 10:00 PM, Friday, July 6 through 6:00 AM, Monday, July 9, with the exception of Sunday during the day. Noise and construction illumination are anticipated as a result of this work. Ann Street property access will be maintained. Pedestrians are encouraged to use Marshall Street. [Map](#)
- Track work is anticipated to occur in the vicinity of Norden Place, on the south side of the New Haven Line, between Howard Avenue and Bridge Street, Monday, July 9 - Sunday, July 15. Weekday work will occur from 6:30 AM-3:30 PM and weekend work from 8:00 AM - 8:00 PM. No impacts to local roads, rail service, or pedestrian traffic are anticipated. Access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- Track work is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line between Washington Street and Jennings Place, Monday, July 9 - Friday, July 13, 6:30 AM - 5:00 PM. No impacts to local roads, rail service, or pedestrian traffic are anticipated and local property access will be maintained. Watch for the entering and exiting of construction vehicles. [Map](#)
- Nighttime catenary foundation drilling is anticipated to occur on the Danbury Line, near Marshall Street and Washington Street, Friday, July 6- Sunday, July 8, 10:00 PM - 6:00 AM. Noise and construction illumination are anticipated. Local property access will be maintained. [Map](#)

Local Road Activity

- A nighttime lane closure will occur on East Avenue to facilitate subsurface investigation work, Monday, July 9 - Friday, July 13 from 9:00 PM - 5:00 AM. Alternating one-way traffic and access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- Ann Street is closed to through traffic to facilitate the first half of the Ann Street Railroad Bridge superstructure replacement. The road will be closed until August 27. Ann Street property access will be maintained. Pedestrian access will be maintained unless otherwise noticed. Please see the [map](#) for detour information.
- Ann Street will temporarily be open to thru traffic, Monday, July 9 from 7:00 PM-5:00 AM to accommodate a crane relocation for the SoNo Collection's project site. Please note, the Pine Street Extension detour of N. Water Street will be closed during this activity and pedestrians are asked to use Marshall Street. [Map](#)

Additional Activity

- Rock grinding will continue on the south side of the New Haven Line railroad tracks, between Howard Avenue and Bridge Street, Wednesday, July 11 - Sunday, July 15. Weekday work will occur from 6:30 AM-3:30 PM and weekend work from 8:00 AM - 8:00 PM. Noise is anticipated as a result of this activity and construction vehicles will remove materials at night between 10:00 PM - 6:00 AM. [Map](#)

- Selective tree clearing work is anticipated to continue on the south side of the New Haven Line railroad tracks, west of Howard Avenue between Triangle and Bridge Street, Monday, July 9 - Friday, July 13 from 8:00 AM-3:30 PM. Noise is anticipated as a result of this activity. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are expected and access to all properties will be maintained. [Map](#)
- House demolition work is anticipated to occur in the vicinity of Goldstein Place, Monday, July 9 - Friday, July 13 from 7:00 AM - 5:00 PM. All access to Liberty Square businesses, residences, and parking will be maintained. Intermittent noise is anticipated as a result of this work. Please watch for the entering and exiting of construction vehicles, which will be parked in front of the three houses. [Map](#)
